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Instructions for preparing apparatus

These instructions give details of the apparatus required by each candidate for each experiment in this paper. A summary of the questions that will be presented to the candidates is included, where appropriate, to allow the Biology teacher who is the supervisor to test the apparatus appropriately.

No access to the question paper is permitted in advance of the examination session.

If a candidate breaks any of the apparatus, or loses any of the material supplied, the matter should be rectified and a note made in the Supervisor's report.

It is assumed that the ordinary apparatus of a science laboratory will be available, including a supply of purified water (distilled or deionised).

If arrangements are made for different sessions for different groups of candidates, care must be taken to ensure that the different groups of candidates are effectively isolated so that **no information passes** between them.

Supervisors are advised to remind candidates that **all** substances in the examination should be treated with caution. Pipette fillers and safety goggles should be used where necessary.

In accordance with COSSH (Control of Substance Hazardous to Health) Regulations, operative in UK, a hazard appraisal of the examination has been carried out.

C = corrosive substance

F = highly flammable substance

H = harmful or irritating substance

O = oxidising substance

T = toxic substance

Instructions for preparing apparatus

Question 1

Each candidate to be provided with the following apparatus and materials:

- (i) $4 \times \text{spinach seedlings}$, *Spinacia oleracea* (common shiny spinach) 50 mm to 100 mm tall, soil rinsed off the roots, placed on petri dish or suitable container
- (ii) 1 × mature spinach leaf, *Spinacia oleracea* (common shiny spinach), dark green and shiny
- (iii) $1 \times 100 \, \text{ml}$ beaker
- (iv) 1 \times transparent plastic bag, about 200 mm \times 110 mm, dry and un-punched (ice bag)
- (v) cotton thread 150 mm to 200 mm

Note: Seedlings to be removed from soil, the soil rinsed from the roots and then the roots to be wrapped in a wet plastic bag until required.

Question 2

Each candidate to be provided with the following apparatus and materials:

- (i) 1 \times boiling tube (20 mm diameter) with glucose solution, about 5 cm³, labelled "glucose solution"
- (ii) $1 \times \text{test-tube}$
- (iii) $1 \times \text{stop}$ watch or sight clock with second hand
- (iv) a 15 cm or 30 cm ruler
- (v) test-tube rack
- (vi) 3g of active yeast (instant yeast) placed on suitable paper
- (vii) 1 balloon
- (viii) syringe or plastic pipette, suitable for delivering 2 cm³ of solution
- (ix) 1 × boiling tube (20 mm diameter) containing 5 cm³ limewater labelled "limewater"

The glucose solution is to be prepared by dissolving 50 g of glucose powder in 250 ml of tap water at room temperature.

Note: protective clothing should be provided where necessary.

The Supervisor is asked to carry out the experiments and to enter the results on a spare copy of the examination paper, clearly marked 'Supervisor's Results' and showing the Centre number. This should be returned with the scripts. Failure to do so may cause the candidates to be penalised.

This form must be completed and returned in the envelope with the scripts together with the seating plan and a copy of the Supervisor's Results.
