Source A

At one of the early congresses I was sitting surrounded by thousands of SA men. As Hitler spoke, I was most interested at the shouts and more often the mumbled exclamations of the men around me, who were mainly workmen or lower middle-class types. 'He speaks for me...he knows how I feel.' One man in particular struck me as he leant forward with his head in his hands, and with a sort of uncontrollable sob said: 'God be thanked, he understands.'
